MEND Establishes Academic Scholarship Program in collaboration with Burlington County College Foundation

Moorestown Ecumenical Neighborhood Development, Inc. (MEND), in collaboration with Burlington County College Foundation, has established a MEND Academic Scholarship program to benefit residents of MEND-owned apartments wishing to further their education at Burlington County College (BCC). Through the program, a maximum of three MEND Academic Scholarships will be awarded each fall and spring semester. This opportunity is open to all MEND residents. Students may receive up to \$1,250 per semester to be used toward tuition, fees and books. Eligible students may qualify for the scholarship up to four semesters, but will be required to re-apply each semester.
